Pluralizing words ending in Y

Another Spelling Rule!

Easy Peazy Lemon Squeezie!

This rule is SO simple you should be able to work it out yourself!

OK, these are correct spellings of the words in the plural: Toys, Babies, Monkeys, Stories, Plays, Beauties, Curries, Trolleys, Donkeys, Bodies.

Now, write out the singular version.

- For example,
 - Boys you write Boy
 - Bodies you write Body.

Look for a Pattern!

- What do you notice about the last letter before the Y and how this decides the ending?
- Boy becomes Boys
- Monkey becomes Monkeys
- > Toy becomes Toys

But

- Curry becomes Curries
- Baby becomes Babies
- Body becomes Bodies

Why?

(Tip Think Vowels and Consonants!)⁽

The Rule

If the letter before the y is a vowel (a e i o u), you just add an s.

If the letter before the y is a consonant, you take off the y and add "ies". Record these spellings in your Spelling Book

Babies, Ladies, Flies, Enemies, Lorries,

> Bodies, Skies, Tragedies, Responsibilities,
