Prefixes go on the front of words!

The “un” Prefix

- What does it mean?
- Put “un” in front of: ***lucky, fortunate, happy, available, reliable, acceptable, desirable, grateful***
- What happens to the meaning of these words?
- That’s right, they reverse!

The 'ir' Prefix

- What does it mean?
- What happens to the meaning when you put "ir" in front of these words: ***regular, relevant, reconcilable, responsible, refutable.***
- That's right, the new word means the opposite!
- Irregular, Irresponsible, Irrelevant, Irrefutable
Irreconcilable,

The 'en' prefix

- You can add "en" to **some** words, making a new word.
- Example: List becomes Enlist (joining the army)



The 'anti' Prefix

- No "Anti", not Auntie!



Anti means opposite!

- Can you think of any 'anti' words in your pairs?
- Anticlimax, Antibiotic, Antichrist (the Devil!), Anticlockwise, Anticyclone, Antihero

The “in” Prefix

- Another prefix that reverses the meaning of the stem word!
- These stem words take “in” rather than “un” or “im”
- Add ‘in’ to these words: ***ability, animate, valid, attentive, digestible, delicate, decisive, human, tolerant, accessible***

Then there is the “il” prefix!

- Again, “il” reverses words! Why so many prefixes for the same job?

Try these words: *legal, legible, literate, legitimate*

- Legal becomes *Illegal*
- Legible becomes *Illegible*
- Literate becomes *Illiterate*
- Legitimate becomes *Illegitimate.*

'in' prefix

- The "in" prefix reverses the meaning of the stem word!

Add 'in' to: ***ability, capable, frequent, elegant, visible***

- Ability = Inability
- Capable = Incapable
- Frequent = Infrequent
- Elegant = Inelegant
- Visible = Invisible
